


Christian Life Ruth Zellar, Vice President

Scholarship Applications Available

Did you know LWML Washington-Alaska District has funds available for those in our membership who are planning to become full time church workers? The person must have a home LCMS congregation in the district, are enrolled in a synodical seminary or university, and have demonstrated a financial need. Currently, the award is up to \$2,000 a year for postgraduate students, and up to \$1,000 a year for undergraduate students. The scholarship awards are sent directly to the financial office of the school and applied to tuition.
