LWML National Convention Report

With approximately 3,500 in attendance in Milwaukee, the women and men of the LWML enjoyed a celebration of worship, fellowship, raising Mites, and hearing the inspiring stories of missionaries both in the U.S. like Phil Zielke of Phil's Friends and Rev. Charles Ferry serving in Taiwan and Rev. Ted Krey serving in the Dominican Republic. An important highlight of the convention is the Mission Flag Presentation, a colorful parade of all the national flags of the countries where the LWML has funded missions. The young woman representatives and the Heart to Heart sisters participated in the beautiful display of over 80 flags. It's an incredible visual of the expanse of the mission outreach of the LWML all over the world.

Hear Young Woman Representative Gracie Holdbrook share about her experience:

The 2023 National Convention was an assembly of women from all walks of life coming together to worship, share conversations, give offerings for mission grants, and be inspired to continue God's work. I found that time to be eye-opening for me. I had no idea that something so small, like mites, can grow to become a tool for so many missions honoring God around the world. I kept remembering the parable of the mustard seed, something so small yet grows to be much larger.

District Bylaw Changes are Coming!

Due to the changes in the bylaws approved at the 2023 LWML Convention in Milwaukee, there will be changes to the district bylaws at the next district convention in Everett, WA in June 2024. The biggest change being considered is the fiscal year timeframe. The current timeframe for our fiscal year is April 1 to March 31. The timeframe being considered is to move the timeframe to July 1 to June 30. For clarity, this change would be an administrative change if approved. The accounting field has some best practices used across the industry and one of their best practices is to have the same time frame for an administrative year and a fiscal year. National changed their bylaws so they can use this best practice. We have the option to change our bylaws about the fiscal year time frame to match the changes at the national level. We are not required to make this change if we choose not to.

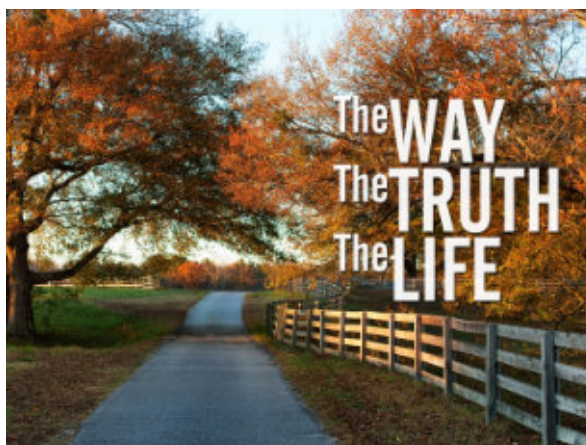


Application: *If we think of the guide as being representative of Jesus, recall His words, “I am the way...” John 14:6.*

Heart to Heart Sisters Celebrate 20 Years at National Convention

When I became the Heart to Heart Committee Chairwoman, President Carolyn said she hoped I would go to the national convention and participate in the Heart to Heart — Sisters of All Nations training program. The seed was planted. I considered it for months and finally decided to go. I was raised that if you are given an opportunity for education or training then you take it.

We had assigned seating and the first day I was next to a woman named Joanna. No kidding, within 3 minutes we were hugging and crying together. She was originally from Sierra Leone and I recognized the cadence and accent to her voice. I asked if she was there during the RUF warfare and she nodded in the affirmative and whispered, “in Freetown.” That may not mean much to most people, but I knew the terror she went through. So as our class began, I had already made a new best friend. (And, someone from our district told me that Joanna had said the same about me.)



For a day and a half, we were trained in how to locate multicultural congregations within our district, how to make initial contact with the congregation’s pastor, how to get invited to visit their congregation, and how to draw in multicultural women to LWML. We shared our culture with each other – let me back-up a tiny bit. Everyone has a culture, Heart to Heart Sisters isn’t only for foreign-born women. Maybe your family is German and you were molded by German values and customs.

We each brought a small item from our culture for the group. One lady who grew up in India brought handmade jewelry for each of us. Reflecting on my Choctaw heritage, I brought “arrowheads” for everyone.

On the second day, we had a banquet with district presidents and there was a pinning ceremony in which our district president gave me a Heart to Heart pin; I’ll be wearing it at all of our district events.

Once convention started, morning H2H sessions started at 6:30am so that we’d be ready for the 8am start of Convention. Then there were the late-night sessions. One included a celebration of the 20th year of Heart to Heart Sisters. The highlight of my convention happened there – the convention Bible study leader, Kaye Wolff, was an original Heart to Heart Sister and I got to meet her and have a conversation.

On the final day, Heart to Heart Sisters could participate in the flag procession. I elected not to do so, and to my horror, Deaconess Betty Knapp, then Vice-President of Special Focus Ministries, told me I still had to go on-stage with the other new H2H Sisters. I was using a motorized scooter and if you know me, you know I only use it at conventions and don’t drive well. I looked like a deer-in-the-headlights on stage looking at about 3,500 people. I whispered to the woman next to me, Denise, “please don’t leave me up here.” She whispered back, “of course I won’t, you’re my sister.”
