Annual scholarships of up to \$1000 a year for undergraduate students and \$2000 a year for postgraduate students are given by the LWML Washington - Alaska District.

The Scholarship Committee has received six applications for the 2021-2022 academic year. These applicants are planning to become Ministers, Directors of Christian Education and Deaconesses and are enrolling at Concordia University in Irvine, California, the Mission Training Center near Irvine, and St Louis Seminary. We have supported one applicant, Kurt Hellwig, for the last three years and, after completing his final year in 2021-2022 at St. Louis Seminary, he will be ready to serve the Lord as a minister.

The Scholarship Committee reviews the applications with required documents and recommends which students should receive a scholarship. The recommendations are sent to the District Executive Committee for a final decision.


