Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Lexington, Kentucky was filled with joyful people "running the Race...Looking to Jesus" during the 2021 LWML convention in June. Twenty-nine people from the Washington-Alaska District attended the convention. Our district delegation consisted of 10 zone delegates, two YWRs, and our Junior Pastoral Counselor. There were 2,800 + people in attendance. One woman even traveled 630 miles by bicycle!

The convention started Thursday evening with a communion service led by LCMS Michigan District President, The Rev. Dr. David P. E. Maier as Proclaimer. We heard from many mission speakers during the convention. Past LWML President Linda Reiser was the keynote speaker. Humorist Interrupters Jan Struck and Abby Goehring as Gertie and Marcy kept us laughing with their convention observations and generational differences. New bylaws and a mite goal of \$2,150,000 were approved. Also approved were 28 mission grants. Over 1,000 people took part in the Photo Finish Mission Walk from Triangle Park to Thoroughbred Park and were cheered on by the presence of comfort dogs. The Mission Pledge Walk brought in \$88,417.42. Tee Up for Mites brought in over \$23,000!

During the Saturday morning processional, Young Woman Representatives and Heart to Heart Sisters (with help from many others) carried flags representing all the countries where LWML mites have helped in missions. In Praise to the LORD! Deaconess Heidi Goehmann led our Bible study based on Hebrews 12:1-2.

We were entertained Saturday night by Cumberland Gap band led by bluegrass singer Billie Renee Johnson. They had us dancing in the aisles!

This past year brought to light the importance of being able to continue the LWML business even if we are unable to meet in person. For an electronic meeting (where business is conducted) to be deemed legal, bylaws must specifically authorize the meeting, and all participants need to be able to hear the proceedings. While face-to-face meetings are preferred, electronic meetings can be used not only during an emergency but also during inclement weather. They also save travel time, expenses for travel, food, and lodging, and enable those not able to attend in person to participate. 














#### Greetings Ladies,


