His enthusiasm for sharing God's love and his obvious love for the people he is working with make his work with Ethiopian and Sudanese people in Renton, Ethiopia, and South Sudan joyfully productive. He teaches Sudanese students to proclaim the love of Christ. King of Kings Lutheran Church in Renton has generously supported his work.

Pastor Both is enrolled in the Mission Training Center in Irvine, California. He wants to improve his English and his knowledge of Lutheran theology so he can teach God's word clearly and correctly.

Pastor Both's wife, Rebecca Bol, currently works at a local hospital as a housekeeper and has supported him throughout his studies and ministry. They have eight children ranging in age from 9 to 30.

Applications for Scholarships for the 2022-2023 academic year are now available on the LWML Washington-Alaska website.

These scholarships are intended to support and encourage students who:

- 1. Have a home congregation within the district,
- 2. Will be attending a Missouri Synod university or seminary, and
- 3. Plan to become a full-time church worker.

Annual scholarships of up to \$1000 for undergraduate students and \$2000 for postgraduate students are awarded to qualifying students to help offset the cost of tuition. If you know qualified students, please encourage them to apply. Applications are due by April 15, 2022

Trinity Olympia Society

The Trinity LWML finished 2021 with three major projects each demonstrating its mission of spreading the good news and showing God's love.

The Mission Fair, an annual craft and baked goods sale with proceeds going to missions, brought in over \$6400 to be split between the Olympia Union Gospel Mission and the City Gates. Both of these local organizations assist local people in the Olympia area.

With donations from members of LWML and the congregation and \$250 from Thrivent, the LWML filled and wrapped 41 boxes for the Seafarers' Center to distribute to men and women working on ships in the Port of Tacoma. The boxes contain socks, toothpaste, hats, and other items. They also contain the message of God's love in several different languages. These boxes help spread the word of God all over the world.

Rather than exchanging gifts, the women of Trinity and members of the congregation donated gift cards for the needy. Fifty-one cards totaling \$775 went to local schools to be given to needy families. Each gift card was accompanied by a Christmas card with a personalized message containing the Gospel message.
