

With some societies becoming inactive, it's important to know that women who are still interested in participating in LWML activities may do so through individual membership. Individual membership is available to communicant women in LCMS congregations with or without an LWML group. Individual membership is designed for those who have an interest in the mission and ministry of the LWML but cannot attend group meetings.

The procedure for becoming an individual member is to request recognition either verbally or in writing from the LWML district president. An individual member may participate in LWML events and activities and may hold elective or appointive offices. She may obtain a subscription for LWML Quarterlies through the district or the LWML office. An individual member sends her mites offerings directly to the district Financial Secretary.

Individual membership is not considered a group or a unit, and therefore does not have voting privileges at the national level but may vote at zone or district meetings at the discretion of those organizations and as determined by their bylaws.

They communicate your wishes with your attorney and other financial professionals and coordinate with the LCMS Foundation to carry out your estate plan.
