My calendar informs me that the next important date in the life of the church is May 17th - The Ascension of Our Lord. One of the readings for that day is from Ephesians 1 in which the sacred writer says “*God has blessed us from the riches of his grace which he has lavished on us in Christ Jesus*”. This week I have been thinking about the word “lavish,” and I’ve been thinking about those times in my life in which I experienced the word lavish. I am thinking of those times that were excessive,

exuberant, and extravagant in luxury.

Last Saturday Beth and I walked past the Hotel Lusso in downtown Spokane. As we did we remembered the “lavish” overnight stay we had there several years ago thanks to the families of my Confirmation class. This was no Motel 6! Everything about our room was lavish, as were the meals provided at the adjacent restaurant.

Last summer our family attended my nephew’s wedding in San Diego. The setting was magnificent! Everything about the wedding and the reception was lavish. Unforgettable!

In my mind the word “lavish” is always associated with riches. The word “lavish” is never associated with poverty, nor frugality.

In Holy Scripture Jesus is consistently “lavishing” people with the riches of His goodness. The wedding feat at Cana and the feeding of the 5,000 are two such events. Extravagant. Excessive. Lavish. Generous.

Here on the Palouse one of the first garden seeds placed in the cool soil are peas. In early summer they will be ready for picking. When you go out to the garden and take a pod and open it how many peas will be inside? More than one I hope. There will be a line of peas that you can toss in your mouth before you pick a bowl full for the evening meal. The same is true for grapes. The vine is full of grapes, not just one. Or you lift up a leaf of a strawberry plant and look under it, you see lush, big ripe strawberries, ready to be eaten. Not one, but several there, waiting to be picked.

The whole of creation is “lavish” - so excessive in its generosity. Why? Because this is the nature of God in the physical world and, as we know, in the spiritual one as well.

Paul says in Ephesians time and time again that God has “lavished us with His grace in Jesus Christ”. Grace freely and excessively given.

This week I read that beneath our skin lies 60,000 miles of veins. My mind can’t comprehend that. And so it is with the luxurious grace of God generously given to us in Jesus Christ. Our minds cannot comprehend what lies beneath the surface of life, but if we get beneath the surface of life, we just might discover the abundant, luxurious, lavish grace of God in our lives.

I realize that as Christians we have to be extra careful in what we say and do so people around us do not get a mixed message. The first half of this biennium ended March 31st so an update on the funds collected is in order. Funds received in the first year of this biennium came from the following sources:

Societies	\$1690.00
Zones	\$ 68.00
Individuals	\$ 790.00
Bear sales	\$ 36.00
2006 Convention offering	\$1784.25

Reviewing the report of the convention manual, I noted that only 25% of the societies in the WA-AK district contributed to the scholarship fund.
