This past week I received a nice letter from John Eldredge and Ransomed Heart Ministries. In this letter he comments on a book entitled, *On the Incarnation* written by Athanasius. Talking about the role Jesus played in our salvation, Athanasius writes, "We will begin, then, with the creation of the world and with God its Maker, for the first fact that you must grasp is this: *the renewal of creation has been wrought by the Self-same Word who made it in the beginning*".

What stunned Eldredge from this book was Anthanasius' view of salvation as "renewal, restoration, the recovery of creation, especially the originally magnificent creation man is".

I have to say that when I think about salvation the first word that comes to mind isn't renewal. I think of "forgiveness"; "atonement of Jesus for our sins";

"heaven when I die." And those things are all true of course. However, they are a very incomplete view of salvation, from Eldredge's perspective, "an impoverished view".

We understand salvation to be "forgiveness and entrance into heaven through the death and resurrection of Jesus." And *it is*, to be sure. Thank God! Only, I think Athanasius and Eldredge are on to something – "...there is more. And that 'more' is so beautiful and so necessary it simply must be recovered."

For me, the easiest way to understand "salvation as renewal or restoration" is being played right now before my very eyes and has been for weeks. The plants and trees outside my office looked completely and totally dead for 6 months. And then one day little green buds appeared, and then leaves come bursting forth. Now there are blossoms and the sweet smells of late spring/early summer. The world around me has been and continues to exude *renewal*.

Nature is also God's word to us, is it not? Scripture makes that quite clear that God speaks to us through the world He created. And what is He speaking to us through the return of spring and summer? Better, let me ask you – what is the effect upon your soul when you see the flowers blooming, the trees a brilliant canopy of green, when you take your shoes off and run through the lush green grass?

It is the message of life, of restoration. The renewal of creation by the one who made it. Eldredge says that a perfectly legitimate synonym for salvation as used in the Bible is simply the word, "Life."

So I'll leave these thoughts with you as you enjoy the earth's splendor this summer: "My salvation is my renewal." God is restoring me, all of me. His life has become my life, and when His life has its way with me, I shall be fully alive.



## 2008 WA-AK Convention Offering Proposals

#### PROPOSAL A:

Sports equipment and storage for Faith Lutheran-Church, School, and Daycare in Lacey, Washington

Faith Lutheran Church, School, and Daycare in Lacey, Washington, in completing a 14,500 square-foot multipurpose building in spring 2008. This building will be used by the school, church, daycare, and the local community. Funds for purchasing sports equipment and storage cabinets for such equipment were not available in the building budget. Money would be used for equipment of basketballs and hoops, volleyballs and nets, tetherballs and poles, dodge balls, and similar indoor sports equipment. If money is available, storage cabinets to store the equipment would be purchased.

The new facility, which includes a gymnasium and class-rooms, was planned for and is anticipated to be a significant tool in mission outreach to local community through the church, school, and daycare. Approximately 80% of the children in the school and daycare are not members of the Faith Lutheran congregation and would benefit by being in a Christian environment.

#### **PROPOSAL B:**

# Scholarships for women preparing for service in LCMS schools and congregations

Scholarships are available to women who are members of Lutheran Church–Missouri Synod congregations within the Washington-Alaska District LWML and who are preparing for a career in the churches or schools of the LCMS. A scholarship recipient must be enrolled in an LCMS college in preparation for a full-time career in the church.

In 2006-2008 biennium, ten scholarships were awarded for education expenses. The women received from \$900 to \$1380 from the \$12,000 received in donations from churches and individuals. In the 2004-2006 biennium, \$11,000 in scholarships were awarded to thirteen women.

With increasing costs for tuition, books and materials, housing, and other college expenses and with desire to encourage women to enter LCMS careers, the WA-AK District LWML Scholarship Committee wishes to be able to award as many scholarships as possible.


